
History & Culture

Boricuas is a term used to refer to the locals of Puerto Rico, reflecting a deep sense of cultural identity and pride in their heritage. Whether visitors are drawn to tropical beaches, historic sites, art museums, or salsa music, San Juan promises a unique and unforgettable experience.



Beaches

From the iconic Flamenco Beach on the island of Culebra, ranked as one of the best in the world, to the pristine shores of Cayo Icacos in the East Region, offering expansive reefs teeming with marine life, each beach offers its own unique slice of paradise.

Whether visitors are snorkelling amidst schools of fish or simply basking in the sun, Puerto Rico's beaches offer unparalleled beauty and tranquillity.

Culinary

The vibrancy of Puerto Rican culture comes alive in its many rich and diverse dishes, a celebration of flavours that visitors have the opportunity to indulge in.

Blending elements of Spanish, African, and native Taíno cuisine, staple dishes include mofongo, made of deep-fried green plantains; tostones, double deep-fried plantain wheels; and lechón asado, a slowly spit-roasted pork dish with juicy meat and crispy skin that was recently declared a Puerto Rican culinary legacy.

Experience the best lechón first hand in Guavate, known as the "pork highway", which is lined with lechoneras (pork restaurants) serving locally sourced pork.

Puerto Rico celebrates sustainability and self-sufficiency with its remarkable tours of local coffee and chocolate plantations, known as Haciendas. These tours offer visitors the opportunity to engage in cooking classes and tasting sessions, providing an immersive experience in the Island's agricultural heritage.




Adventure

For adventurers, Puerto Rico's natural wonders provide endless opportunities for discovery and exploration. El Yunque National Forest, nestled on the Island's East side, stands as the only tropical rainforest in the U.S., offering rugged trails, breathtaking waterfalls, and unparalleled biodiversity.

Ziplining amongst the lush green canopies and chirpy parrots is also highly recommended for nature lovers! Situated on the Island's East coast, visitors can experience one of Puerto Rico's natural wonders at Laguna Grande - a bioluminescent bay. Kayaking through the bay reveals a magical display of tiny dinoflagellates illuminating the water with their glow. And for those seeking subterranean thrills, the impressive caves of Puerto Rico offer a fascinating realm for hiking, spelunking, and even rafting.

Situated in the North Region, Camuy is home to the world's third-largest underground river and one of the more complex cave systems on the planet at the Rio Camuy Cave Park. Explore its ecosystems — home to over 16 bat species, the natural forms of stalagmites, stalactites, and even sinkholes.


